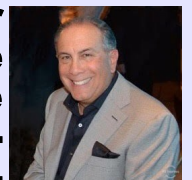

MCC Covid 19 Community Relief Efforts

KICK-OFF COVID-19 COMMUNITY DONATION

On March 23, 2020, Chuck Ng, the representative of "Berkeley Chinese Alumni International Association" (BCAIA) and "Chinese Community for COVID-19 Relief" (CCCR) was accompanied by:

MCC Board members Margaret Fung, Nienhwa Cheng, Marian Kong, John Muniz, Vivian Li to go to Peninsula Health Care District office to give the medical PPE to support Mills Peninsula Hospital. The supplies included 140 N95 Alpha Protech masks, 75 Dupont Tyvek 400 Coveralls, 1200 Curad Gloves and 1200 Nitrile Exam Gloves(400 L, 400 M and 400 S) which were donated by BCAIA and CCCR.

On March 30, 2020 MCC Board members delivered 1190 pcs KN95 masks and 180 pcs N95 masks to Peninsula Hospital.

On April 1, 2020 MCC Board members and Lion's Club Board members delivered 2880 pcs KN95 masks to Peninsula Hospital, 720 pcs KN95 masks to City of Millbrae for police, fire, DPW staffs

On April 2, 2020 MCC Board members delivered 150 pcs Dupont Tyvek 400 coveralls to Peninsula Hospital, and 500 pcs Disposable medical masks to Millbrae Skilled Care.

On April 5, 2020 MCC volunteer Katherine Zhang delivered 1500 pcs disposable medical masks, 50 pcs coveralls, 10000 gloves (donated by Shelly Chen's group of Fans of Teresa Teng), 80 pcs KN 95 masks (donated by Full Life Church) to Dr. Zhang, CEO of Chinese Hospital.

On April 12, 2020 MCC Board member delivered 3800 pcs Disposable Medical Masks to Peninsula Health Care District.

On April 15, 2020 MCC volunteer delivered 1600 pcs Surgical Masks, 1000 pcs masks (donated by donors in China Canton Shen Zhen), 5000 gloves (donated by Shelly Chen's group of Fans of Teresa Teng) to Chinese Hospital

On April 22, 2020 MCC Board member delivered 1700 pcs KN95 Masks and 700 pcs face shields to Peninsula Health Care District.

On April 22, 2020 MCC Board members delivered a check of \$2500 to Mills Rapid Relief Fund to support the families that are struggling during this very difficult and challenging time.

On April 24, 2020 MCC volunteer delivered 68 pcs coveralls, 150 pcs KN 95 masks, 300 pcs face shields, 96 bottles of 16 oz hand sanitizers, 900 pcs masks (donated by 1976 Taipei First Girl's High School Alumnae in northern California), to Chinese Hospi-

Important Community Information from the City of Millbrae



DRAW YOUR CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT

CITY OF MILLBRAE

The City of Millbrae is currently an at-large elections system, which means voters of the entire City elect the five City Council members. Unfortunately, due to the threat of ongoing litigation the City is required to form City Council Districts. As a general law City, the City has the option to:

A) Divide into five separate City Council districts with a rotating Mayor

OR

B) Divide into four separate City Council districts with a at large elected Mayor.

Each councilmember must reside within the district and chosen only by the electors residing in that particular district.

HOW TO GET INVOLVED

The City will be holding a series of virtual public hearing and community workshops to receive public input on where district lines should be drawn. At these events you can share feedback and suggestions for new district lines in the City of Millbrae. You can also participate remotely through online forms and mapping tools.
